# **Council Meeting Minutes**

March 14, 2024

## 1.Call meeting to order

Irene MacCaull welcomes all to the meeting.

## 2. Wellington Fire Department Report

Fire chief Leon Perry presented a report to the members of council since the last council meeting:

- 3 calls (2 motor vehicles & 1 medical first responder).
- 2 firefighters attended hazardous course.
- 5 firefighters starting training weekend of March 16th.
- Fire department received new helmets.
- Fire department received eight (8) new radios.
- Thirteen (13) firefighters completed MFR certificate course.
- Fire chief will reach out to the Smart Program to find out what can be done to reduce the threat of fires in the community.

### 3. Approval of agenda

- Donation to the Acadian Festival added to the agenda.

It is moved and seconded that the agenda be approved as presented.

# **5. Approval of minutes** – February 15, 2024

### 6. Business arising from the minutes

### a. Affordable housing

CAO informed council regarding the meeting held with the developers on March 13<sup>th</sup>. Members representing three (3) developers attended the meeting with outgoing CAO informing the developers that the rural community of Wellington had been awarded funding amounting to over \$478,000 over a four (4) year period. The funding will be used to help developers build road(s), install sewer and storm sewers along with street curbs. Mrs. Arsenault stressed to the developers that at least twelve (12) units of affordable housing must be built over the next three (3) years for the community to get the full amount of the funding. The other areas that the funding will be used for, include the following: lagoon capacity study, delineation study for all undeveloped land within the municipality, study on housing needs, study on possibility of extending boundaries of the municipality, and hiring an IT firm to permit users to fill out the development permit online. Developers had a few questions and both CAO and outgoing CAO answered their questions. Official announcement of the funding will be held on Monday March 25<sup>th</sup> at 11:00am at Place du Village in Wellington.

The office received a call from another interested developer who is inquiring about the possibility of developing land on Barlow Road.

A fourth (4) developer, who was not able to attend the developers' meeting on March 13<sup>th</sup> had a telephone conversation with CAO and outgoing CAO Arsenault on March 14<sup>th</sup>. We provided the same information that was given to the developers at last night's meeting.

RFP will be published tomorrow regarding the lagoon capacity study with April 15, 2024, set as the deadline for receiving quotes on the study.

### b. PEI Department of Transportation work updates

The office sent an email to Steven Yeo regarding the possibility of having storm sewers installed on Sunset Drive between the Wellington Legion and Maple Street. No news was received from Mr. Yeo as of today.

#### c. Pollinators Park

The well has not been dug yet and it may be too late to have it done now as the ground is not that frozen. Mayor MacCaul tried her best to get the well drillers to dig the well but to no avail. A member of council brought up the possibility of moving the park to another location. Council will discuss the matter at another meeting.

### d. Subdivision applications

Wellington Estates - no update

Countryview Holdings – no update

AJL subdivision – Dale Thompson of the Department of Environment has the written report from WSP. We are waiting for their decision.

Barlow Road development – a new developer is looking into developing the property.

### e. IRAC report

CaO informed the meeting that the report will be ready for the May council meeting.

# f. Childcare centre request

Centre Académie d'Exploration provided a cheque of \$4,200 to cover the extra \$700 per month in rental fees from September 1, 2023 to March 31, 2024.

Childcare centre has requested that a commercial dishwasher be installed in the kitchen area with the childcare centre paying for the purchase and installation of the dishwasher. The dishwasher will stay in place after the childcare centre moves to another location.

Moved and seconded to let the childcare centre install a commercial dishwasher in the kitchen area of the Vanier Centre.

#### 7. Finance

Year to date monthly report

Outgoing CAO presented the 2024-2025 budget report that was presented at the public meeting back on March 6, 2024.

The fire department would like to have their own bins at the fire department. Right now, the fire department bring their recyclables and waste once a week to the bins at the Vanier Centre. With the daycare as a tenant at the Vanier Centre, the bins get filled quickly. CAO will talk to maintenance about an extra bin.

Moved and seconded to approve the 2024-2025 budget report.

  - a) CAO informed the meeting that Curran & Briggs will check the cracks in the spring at the request of AJL Ltd.
  - b) Will have more info for May meeting.
  - c) The childcare centre discussed an issue to CAO about water gathering in front of the step of the doors that once led to the Firemen's Club.

The CAO went to see why water was gathering there. The CAO sprayed some salt on the water as there was ice beneath the water. This is a security issue. The CAO spoke to the maintenance person, and asked him if he could fix the end of the downspout so that the water would head towards Mill Road. Water is also running from the back of the Vanier Centre on a rainy day and fills up the space in front of the doors. He told the CAO that when Curran & Briggs did some work on the parking lot, they made a cut in the asphalt too close to the Vanier Centre and during the winter either water or melting snow goes into the cut and when the temperature goes down, the asphalt heaves; thus there is a slope going towards the doors and on a rainy day, water collects in front of the doors. Council will look at this issue and see what can be done.

#### 9. Health Center update

A public meeting was held on January 29th with MLA Gilles Arsenault presiding over the meeting. The Rural Community of Wellington was designated as a medical home. A 211 medical line is in place to help the public navigate the provincial government departments. It is the consensus that there are not enough health workers in the system. Would it be possible that the proposed health centre in Wellington share health workers with Tyne Valley and Summerside. No talk on whether we're getting a doctor a nurse practitioner.

# a) Development permits

No development permits were submitted to RMW.

### b) Budget consultation

The budget consultation meeting was held on March 6<sup>th</sup> at the Place du Village. Both outgoing CAO and mayor MacCaull presented the 2024-2025 budget numbers for the Rural Community of Wellington, the Wellington Fire Department, and the Wellington Sewer Utilities. A number of questions were asked by rate

payers in attendance and CAO and Mayor replying to their questions. The rate payers in attendance seemed satisfied with the proposed budget numbers.

# c) Approval of tax rates for 2024-2025

The Rural Community of Wellington received the tax role for the 2024-2025 fiscal year. Outgoing CAO included the new tax rates in the 2024-2025 budget figures.

It is moved and seconded that the tax rates for the 2024-2025 fiscal year be adopted.

# d) Wellington Legion solar panels

Outgoing CAO informed council about the solar panels project at the Wellington Legion. Outgoing CAO will contact Gilles Painchaud to submit a development permit to start the 21 day process.

It was moved and seconded that Council accept Wellington legion's plan to install solar panels behind the legion.
